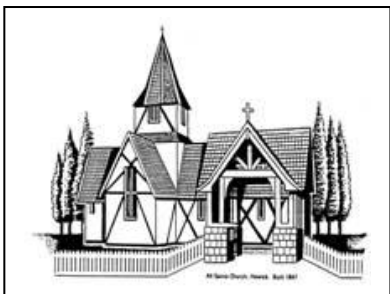

Government Budget

The weekly rates of New Zealand Superannuation and Veteran's Pension (for those on tax code "M") are estimated to increase from 1 April 2018 by:

- \$6.60 a week for one member of a married/civil union couple

Andrew Adams from NZ Border Control will speak about *From Pharaohs, Kings and Gentlemen of Nights to Kororareka and Computers*. Before 1840 Kororareka (Russell) was the largest European settlement in New Zealand. It was originally a watering base for the whaling ships which visited the Bay of Islands.

The June speaker was Mr Bob Narev who spoke about surviving the holocaust after he and his parents were imprisoned in Theresienstadt Concentration Camp in Czechoslovakia during World War Two. He said it was important to remind people today of the horror and quoted English philosopher Edmund Burke *The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing*. Mr Narev's father died in the camp and after the war Mr Narev and his mother went to Switzerland before coming to New Zealand aged 12. He has been involved in law for 60 years.
