Exploring History: Continuing our study of Russia we are gradually building up to the time of Peter the Great. But so much happened prior to him becoming Tsar that we have lots of twists and turns, countries being annexed, lost and regained, wars being fought won and lost but most of all, the people in power behind this.

Boris Godunov being one. He is mentioned being at the court of Ivan the Terrible, becoming a member of his personal guard. His female family members being married off into influential families, if not accepted or became widowed, all that was open to them was the convent - taking the veil.. Godunov himself became very powerful usurping the regency. It was not a happy time in Russia for the peasantry, plague and famine and being forced off their land, becoming 'unfree' serfs, and the worst was yet to come. Patricia

Famous and Infamous - At our April meeting, each member contributed to a talk / discussion about the O.E.C.D. It was agreed that the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, of which New Zealand is a member makes a significant contribution to the world, providing a platform to compare policy experiences, seek answers to common problems, identify good practices and co-ordinate the domestic and international policies of its 37 members. Although the OECD does not have the power to enforce its decisions, even following unanimous votes by its members, it is recognised as a highly influential publisher of mostly economic data. Geology - The Group went to Stony Batter on Waiheke for a Geology and History Field Trip. Stony Batter has some unusual large, rounded and fluted andesite boulders from a broken up lava flow from a volcano active about 8 million years ago. However, it is also the site of a huge tunnel complex constructed in WWII for three 9 inch guns to protect the outer harbour. The complex was very secret and the constructors and military were not able to leave the site during the construction. We were given a guided tour by Tim Moon who is a historian and has been the key instigator of the site preservation. We were amazed by the whole project. - Stony Batter is at the far end of Waiheke and to reach it requires a 20k drive and a scenic 1k walk from the car park. It is well worth a visit. - Our next meeting will be a field trip to Mangere Mountain volcano weather permitting. If not then there will be a very interesting BBC video "When the earth melted". Industrial Revolution - One of our 36 Lectures will discuss Poets, Novelists and Factories so Patricia Coleman opened our meeting with some insights to stimulate our thinking of the types of presentations available to us, should we so wish to do a so. And it has been picked up.

Agriculture, Cities and Manufacturing Traditions was our main focus for today.discussing the shift to enclosure of fields therefore depriving those who had no proof that they had legal entitlement to the land were thrown off; more for the wealthier landlords.Improvement in animal breeding saw new breeds of sheep and cattle for wool and meat. Innovations in farm machinery improved production of wheat, barley etc. In particular, seed drills were used instead of the usual 'broadcasting" of seed - but the birds went hungry. The city of London had long been the port where everything manufactured in the colonies was brought to be exported, with trading companies holding a monopoly - a bone of contention for many people. Bristol, Edinburgh, Norwich, York, Exeter and Newcastle were alternative ports for the smaller hinterland with Bristol, Liverpool and Glasgow all facing the Atlantic Ocean therefore growing prosperous through trade in slaves, tea, tobacco and sugar. 

All three missions were launched last July to take advantage of the close alignment of Earth and Mars. NASA have successfully landed the Perseverance rover [in February 2021] near an ancient river delta and will now spend 2 years drilling into rocks that may hold evidence of life ,3—4 billion years ago, upon the red planet.
