OUR SPEAKER FOR FEBRUARY is Rob High, Philanthropy Officer for the New Zealand Red Cross is our speaker.

The Red Cross is the largest humanitarian movement in the world. We all recognise the emblem – but what is actually behind the well-known symbol? How did this globe-spanning organisation come to be and what does it

actually do? In this presentation you will hear about the humble beginnings of the Red Cross, learn what we do internationally – and the programmes and services offered here by own national society, New Zealand Red Cross.

Rob High joined NZRC in 2011 (originally as a volunteer). He has held a variety of different roles within the organisation, from coordinating local Community Programmes and liaison to our Volunteer Branches, to managing city-wide street collection appeals in Auckland, Whangarei and locations in Northland. More recently, he coordinated the Red Cross activation at Field days 2022 in Hamilton (the first time Red Cross have been invited to attend).

Gary Soneji is a murderous serial kidnapper who wants to commit the crime of the century. Up against him is Alex Cross, a black homicide detective with a Ph.D. in psychology. Our reader says that this is the first Alex Cross book with at least 26 in the series. Our reader tried the next two and gave up as he didn't want to read any more about deranged killers.

PS I Love You: Cecelia Ahern (2002) – Holly and Gerry's world is suddenly shattered when Gerry gets cancer and dies. This is the story of his last bequest which is a monthly list to help her to get her life back on track. It is brutally sad and uplifting at the same time.
