Professor Buckley is a Professor in the Department of Anatomy at University of Otago. Her research interests focus on the effect of different cultural and ecological environments on the health and disease of prehistoric peoples in the Asia-Pacific region. This research is conducted by the analysis of museum-curated Pacific Island human skeletal remains and recently-excavated samples from Vanuatu and Papua New Guinea, Vietnam, Thailand, and Indonesia. Most recently she has co-directed a bioarchaeological research project on gold mining era cemeteries in Otago.
