#### A Word from our President

Our Committee met last week and supported the notion that we hold our monthly meeting on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> September with Helen Howarth (on Bullock Creek) and Monique Kelly (on Global Sustainability Goals and their

translation into the activities of the local community) as our speakers. While we are eager to get started again, we are mindful that the Government is unlikely to lift the Level Two restrictions currently imposed on us.

We are not anticipating more than 100 people attending, we will request that you sign in when you arrive at St Johns, and use the sanitiser provided. We will increase the distances between seats, and if you feel more comfortable you are welcome to wear a mask. We will not serve hot drinks / tea or coffee at the break between speakers; please bring your own drink. If the weather allows we will open the doors to allow some circulation of attendees outside the Hall during the break.

If you are symptomatic, or may have been in contact with someone who might be asymptomatically carrying SARS-CoV-2 ie visiting from Auckland and been in contact with the identified community there, or working at our quarantine facilities, we ask you not to attend this meeting – the risks are small but our U3A include some people who would have increased susceptibility. Our thirst for knowledge should not be taken with increased risk, and if there are suddenly cases appearing in the South Island / Otago forgive us if we need to cancel at short notice.

Overall, I believe we can be optimistic, but we realise that some will decline attending until there have been no new cases reported in NZ. And one day I would like to chair a meeting: Can Medicine Deliver Us From These Evils, or does the solution rest with ourselves?




The game can be learned in an hour or so, leaving the rest of your life to go on improving. Whatever your level of skill the game is both enjoyable and challenging.

#### September is NZ Suffrage Month

September 19, 1893 is the day we remember and celebrate the day that women in New Zealand were granted the right to vote alongside men. This occurred because many women and men worked hard together to convince the government of the day this was the right and proper thing to do.

Today we have a group of young people and their supporters who are asking us to consider that 16- and 17-year olds should also have this right to vote. Some of us probably do not agree with this. However, I believe we need to listen to them and show respect for them and their reasons.

Consider this: at age 16 years they are closer in age to our current Prime Minister, aged 40 years, than many of us can claim to be. Government decisions made currently will probably affect the lives of these young folk longer than it will our lives.

Yes, some 16- and 17-year olds may not be seen as mature enough to vote but doesn't that apply to some adults as well?

So all I am asking is that we all listen to our young suffragists, respect their views and support their rights to bring this to the attention of all ages.
