July 2022 Meeting:

Date: 8th July 2022

Venue: Darfield Baptist Church, 15 Greendale Road, Darfield.

member's announcements followed by the speaker).

Topic: Vitamin C and Health: A focus on cancer, diabetes and infection.

The role of vitamin C in cancer and the common cold has been a controversial topic for many decades, with much of the early research being inspired by the work of two times Nobel Prize winner Linus Pauling. We now know that much of the controversy, particularly around vitamin C and cancer, was due to a misunderstanding around the way vitamin C is taken up by the body. Unlike most other animal species, we cannot make our own vitamin C, and so we must get it through our diet in order to survive. Importantly, when a person comes down with an acute illness such as an infection, or has a chronic condition such as cancer, their requirements for vitamin C increase and in severe cases, intravenous vitamin C is required in order to get enough vitamin C into the body. This presentation will cover the rationale behind oral versus intravenous vitamin C use and the role of vitamin C in preventing and treating acute and chronic conditions such as cancer, diabetes and infections, including the latest research around COVID-19.

Speaker.

Associate Professor Anitra Carr is the Director of the Nutrition in Medicine Research Group at the University of Otago's Christchurch School of Medicine. Anitra is considered an international expert on the role of vitamin C in human health and disease and was recently awarded a Gold Medal for research excellence. Following a PhD at the University of Otago, Christchurch, Anitra carried out an American Heart Association Post-Doctoral Fellowship at the Linus Pauling Institute, Oregon State University, USA. Whilst there she produced a number of high impact publications on the role of vitamin C in human health and disease; one of these was used by the US Food and Nutrition Board of the Institutes of Medicine as a basis for their increase of the recommended dietary intake for vitamin C. In 2016 Anitra was awarded a Sir Charles Hercus Health Research Fellowship to investigate the role of vitamin C in severe infection such as pneumonia and sepsis. Anitra is currently chair of the scientific advisory board for the UK vitaminC4covid initiative and Associate Editor for the journal Nutrition Research. She continues to carry out translational research into the role of vitamin C in the prevention and treatment of acute and chronic diseases such as cancer, diabetes and infection
